DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

Construction at Heathy Wood continues to build to schedule and further works are underway to connect the new community to its neighbours.

With the new bus route up and running through the site and the bus gate control on Worsell Drive in operation, additional signage is being prepared to advise drivers of the access restrictions. These will be installed later this summer, however car and motorcycle drivers are reminded that there is no access for Heathy Wood to or from Shipley Bridge Lane.

Exploratory works to confirm the location of all services in preparation for the widening project on Shipley Bridge Lane have completed. Once the utility companies have confirmed their works we will be able to schedule the core of the widening works which will particularly assist the buses and protect pedestrians along this part of the new route.

Works on St. Modwen Logistics unit on the A264, Copthorne Way continues to progress with the steel framework commencing. Large lorries delivering the steel beams will be accessing the site along Barbour Drive and drivers are advised to take extra care during this time at the junction with Worsell Drive.

Additional works to control vehicle speeds along Worsell Drive and to improve disabled parking and access at the St. Modwen Homebuyer's Hub is underway, as well as various fencing repair and maintenance work across the site.





SPEED SIGN DESIGNED BY HEATHY WOOD DUO

The Taylor Wimpey team at Heathy Wood worked with pupils at Fairway Infant School to design a speed safety sign which has been installed at its Heathy Wood development.

The winners were a brother and sister duo - five-year-old Arjun and seven-year-old Jelissa Singh - who combined to create a striking entry with the call to action 'you must not be fast, slow down'.

They received a £50 voucher from Taylor Wimpey South Thames for their outstanding work, and have seen their drawing brought to life.

Pupils were encouraged to design a sign that would ask drivers to slow down, with the winning entry now sitting pride of place at the entry to Taylor Wimpey's housing phase.

Both Arjun and Jelissa went to visit their creation recently, along with Emma Singleton, Acting Headteacher at Fairway Infant School.

Emma said: "Our pupils had a fantastic time designing their speed signs. They should all be very proud of themselves.

"We are grateful to Taylor Wimpey South Thames for giving our pupils the opportunity to unleash their creativity while also making a real difference to road safety in the local area. We have already welcomed families to our school from Heathy Wood and we take comfort from the fact that the signs created by our talented pupils will help to keep all of our community safe.

SUSTAINABLE TRAVEL

Residents at Heathy Wood have been enjoying their sustainable travel vouchers, the most popular ones being for cycle equipment, a Metrobus pass, and rail tickets to help them travel more sustainably to work or for leisure!

Bus Travel

As you have probaly seen, the 281 Metrobus service now routes through Heathy Wood!

From Heathy Wood to Three Bridges Station, Copthorne, East Grinstead and beyond - this hourly bus service is a sustainable alternative to the car for local trips.

To make using the bus easier, your sustainable travel voucher can be redeemed for a bus pass. If you have Iready used your voucher and want to take the bus more? Until the end of October, Metrobus have capped single fare bus journeys at £2 for all Metrobus services, not just the 281!



Representatives from St. Modwen will be on hand to answer questions about the site, get to know the community and enjoy the festivities with everyone in the area.


The annual carnival is a major event where the streets play host to floats, dancers and colourful characters as well as a selection of stalls and games.
